And there are too many loopholes in the recruitment process that expose the workers to all types of foul play. The decision makers should handle the issue on two fronts. First, there should be a clear agreement with the host governments on the terms and conditions of the jobs that will be offered to Bangladeshis. Much emphasis should be laid on the question of their basic rights being upheld. Secondly, the activities of local recruitment agencies must come under some kind of regulation. We cannot allow such a huge number of people being cheated in the name of employment abroad.
